Bear Creek Quilt Guild Board Meeting – November 3, 2009
First United Methodist Church, Keller TX

President Kimberly Sparks called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

Members attending were: Kimberly Sparks, Judy Shearer, Kathy Jurich, Rachel Cowley, Linda Davis, Shawn Frazier, Loretta Brennan, Charlene Sadley, Michelle Lewis, Kayleen Allen, Mary Davidson, Bonnie Miller, and Sue Ellis.

Motion to approve the September 2009 minutes was made by Sue Ellis and seconded by Loretta Brennan and the motion carried.

Treasurer report was given by treasurer, Kathy Jurich. The work in progress budget for 2010 was presented and discussed. The budget will be published in the December newsletter and voted on at the December guild meeting.

Program update was given by Rachel Cowley. 2010 programs have been filled. Visitors will be charged a \$5 fee when a national speaker charges \$300 or more. Discussion was held over coordinating speakers with other guilds. The December 2009 guild meeting will be a party and potluck at 6:30pm. Members may bring a Christmas ornament to exchange.

Workshop chair, Kayleen Allen, stated that she will add “no refunds” unless you get someone to fill your spot and they reimburse you to the workshop registration forms. The non-member price for 2010 workshops will be \$45.

Loretta Brennan presented a quilt show update. Vendors are signing up. A publicity push is starting as the show is 6 months away. A motion was made by Kathy Jurich and seconded by Rachel Cowley to increase the quilt show budget for the remainder of the year by \$600. The motion passed.

Shawn Frazier, Raffle Ticket Chair reported that raffle ticket sales are going well.

Retreat chair, Bonnie Miller, reported that the retreat is filled and there is a waiting list. The contract is signed and final payment is due in January 2010.

Mary Davidson, historian, has boxes of old photos. She will bring these to an upcoming guild meeting to share with members.

In new business, new committee chairs will be recognized at the November guild meeting. A 2011 raffle quilt chair is needed. Discussion was held on relocating the storage facility to a more accessible area.

The next board meeting will be on December 1, 2009.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:32pm.

A year flies by so quickly! It is time for our last program of the year on December 15th. We will do a pot luck Holiday Dinner. A-H last names bring salads; I-P last names bring entrees; and Q-Z last names bring desserts. Don't forget serving utensils! The Board will bring the drinks, and Hospitality (Dee Watts) will supply plates, cups and cutlery. A Pieceful Daze Bee has graciously volunteered to make centerpieces for our tables. Please start to bring your food at 6 pm so we can sit down to feast at 6:30. Please note very well to **omit** peanuts from any of your dishes. This is the Church's request as some child or children are highly allergic to peanuts.

Since I am Queen of Programs, I choose to have a **Holiday Block Exchange**. For every **2 blocks** you bring you get a chance to win all the blocks! If we have a lot of participants, then we can have 2 winners.

Directions for Holiday Log Cabin blocks:

Unfinished log cabin block is 8 1/2". Half the block is whites, the other half greens and reds, mixed.

Cut the center hearth 2 1/2" square, (finishes at 2"), color gold/yellow

Cut logs 1 1/2" wide, (finishes at 1"), color white, green and/or red, scrappy

The first two logs that you sew to center gold/yellow square are whites. The third and fourth logs are red and/or greens. Go around the cabin clockwise. This sets the pattern. There are three rounds of logs. Make sure your block is 8 1/2" when done. Hint: Just make the last logs a little bigger and trim the block *down* to 8 1/2".

We can never have too many holiday quilts!

Quilters who attended the workshop agreed that it was fun and fast just like the workshop name. Frieda taught techniques for raw edge fusing and transferring pieces from her Sundance pattern. The techniques included learning pattern placement for fussy cutting, use of release paper, fabric layering for shadows and cutting with a crinkled edge rotary cutter. She also gave tips for quilting and cleaning any fusing residue off your iron. The beautiful hand dyed fabrics in the purchased kit had light to dark colors in the same fabric piece and was used for the flowers and leaves. Everyone enjoyed the workshop and now have a wall hanging to keep or give as a gift.

2010 Quilt Show Silent Auction Guidelines



As previously reported, the 2010 Quilt Show Silent Auction will include any quilted item, e.g., small quilts, table runners, bags, pincushions, etc. We encouraged every member of the guild to submit a minimum of one entry for the auction. The entries are made and donated to the guild for a fund-raiser.

Elizabeth Gage and Janice Irick will start accepting entries at the January guild meeting with the deadline for entries being the March guild meeting.

Judging of the auction entries will be limited to the small quilts.

Guidelines for the auction are as follows:

- Small quilts should be 24 inches or less on each side.
- You may use any technique you would like to make your quilt.
- Do not feel limited to making "miniature" sized blocks if you piece your quilt.
- The quilt must be bound and include a hanging sleeve wide enough to accommodate a small dowel.
- Please label your quilt with, as a minimum, the name of the quilt and your name as the maker.
- Only the small quilts will be subject to judging.

Bear Creek Quilt Guild 2010 Quilt Show

ENTRY DIVISIONS AND CATEGORIES

Your quilt show committee for 2010 has decided to offer more categories for entering your quilts in the 2010 show by having 3 different divisions...**Master, Artisan, and Open Divisions.**

You will qualify to enter your quilts in the **Master Division** if you answer yes to any one of the following:

- You have won two or more blue ribbons in any judged competition, locally or nationally. This includes ribbons won by the entrant or the quilter. Blue ribbons won in a Group Category do not count.
- You have published a pattern or book.
- You have professionally taught quilting classes.

In preparation for our next show in 2012, we will be adding a 4th criterion:

- You have sold your work or profited from your quilting in any way.

You will qualify to enter your quilts in the **Artisan Division** if you have not met the criteria listed under the Master Division.

The **Open Division** may be entered by both Master and Artisan quilters.

The quilt show committee reserves the right to change the category of any entry as appropriate.

ENTRY CATEGORIES

Master Division:

1. **Pieced, large**
A pieced quilt in which the length plus width totals 120" or more and is primarily patchwork; hand or machine quilted
2. **Appliqué, large**
An appliquéd quilt in which the length plus width totals 120" or more and is primarily appliqué; hand or machine quilted
3. **Pieced, small**
A pieced quilt in which the length plus width totals at least 30" but less than 120" and is primarily patchwork; hand or machine quilted
4. **Appliqué, small**
An appliquéd quilt in which the length plus width totals at least 30" but less than 120" and is primarily appliqué; hand or machine quilted
5. **One person, pieced or appliqué, machine quilted**
A quilt that has been made and machine quilted by one person; may be pieced or appliquéd
6. **One person, pieced or appliqué, hand quilted**
A quilt that has been made and hand quilted by one person; may be pieced or appliquéd

**Artisan's Division:**

7. **Pieced, large**
A pieced quilt in which the length plus width totals 120" or more and is primarily patchwork; hand or machine quilted
8. **Appliqué, large**
An appliquéd quilt in which the length plus width totals 120" or more and is primarily appliquéd; hand or machine quilted
9. **Pieced, small**
A pieced quilt in which the length plus width totals at least 30" but less than 120" and is primarily patchwork; hand or machine quilted
10. **Appliqué, small**
An appliquéd quilt in which the length plus width totals at least 30" but less than 120" and is primarily appliquéd; hand or machine quilted
11. **One person, pieced or appliquéd, machine quilted**
A quilt that has been made and machine quilted by one person; may be pieced or appliquéd
12. **One person, pieced or appliquéd, hand quilted**
A quilt that has been made and hand quilted by one person; may be pieced or appliquéd

Open Division:

13. **Miniature**
A quilt in which no side measures more than 24"; all interior blocks are no larger than 4". (This is separate from the small quilt auction.)
14. **Art Quilts**
A quilt of any size in which a technique or combination of techniques or materials are used in a non-traditional way. This **MUST** be an original design, **NOT** a pattern or kit.
15. **Chairman's Choice**
A quilt in which no side measures less than 60" and uses 1930's original or reproduction fabrics. Background fabric need not be 30's fabric.
16. **Kits/ Block-of-the-month**
A quilt of any size in which the patterns and fabrics have been packaged as a kit or unit for retail sale
17. **Group/Friendship**
A quilt made by a group of three or more persons
18. **Mixed Techniques**
A quilt that is approximately 50% pieced and 50% appliquéd, or 50% pieced and 50% embroidered; or any combination of the three techniques.
19. **Other Techniques**
Any quilt, such as rag quilt, yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy quilt, wholecloth, redwork, chenille, etc. that does not fit into other categories.
20. **Garments**
Items of clothing that include a recognizable amount of patchwork, appliquéd, and/or quilting.
21. **Juniors**
A quilt made by someone 17 years of age or younger, either a group or individual effort. These quilts will not be judged.
