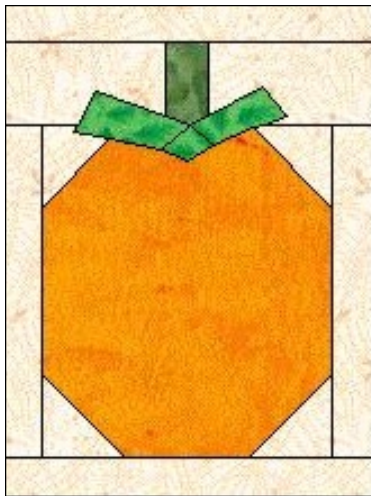

Linda and Nancy asked everyone to introduce themselves and describe their quilting experience and expertise. Then the instructors used a bell to gather attendees together when they presented a technique, their favorite methods for stitching curves and answered questions.

Nancy and Linda were very helpful and told everyone "you paid for this class and took the time out to come and we are here for you". Also, they brought all the quilts shown at the guild meeting so everyone could look at them more closely. Everyone appreciated the fun and informative class.





September Block of the Month



This pattern has been reprinted with permission of the Uncommon Threads Quilt Guild of Germantown, Tennessee.

The block will finish at $9\frac{1}{2}$ x $12\frac{1}{2}$ before connecting it to other blocks.

Cut the pieces as described on the right.

1. Mark a diagonal line on your 2 inch squares. Place each square, right sides together on each corner of the orange block. Stitch on each marked line and

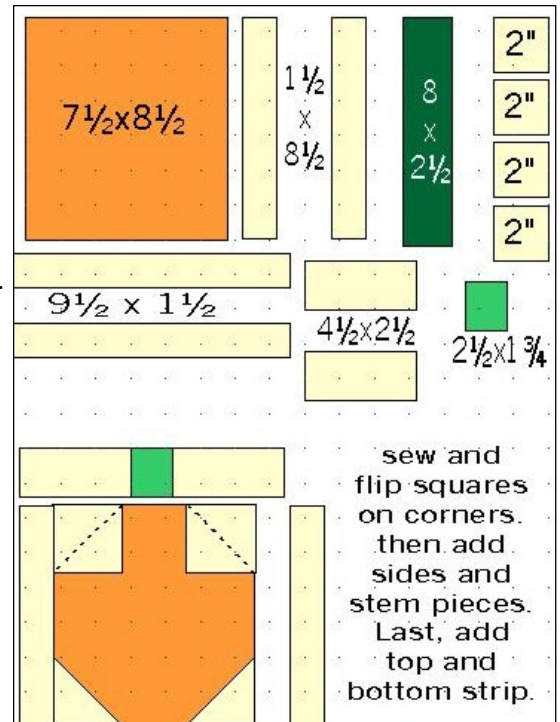
fold the inside corner back to make 'rounded' edges on your pumpkin.

2. Trim the excess triangles off your pumpkin corners, and press. Add the side strips. Press.

3. Sew your green stem piece between your two short background rectangles. Attach it to the top of the pumpkin block. Press.

4. Add the long $9\frac{1}{2}$ x $1\frac{1}{2}$ strips to the top and bottom. Press.

5. Tie an overhand knot in your long green piece. Tack onto the bottom of the stem with a few hand stitches for a bow.



sew and flip squares on corners. then add sides and stem pieces. Last, add top and bottom strip.

For each block you bring to the September guild meeting your name will be entered into the drawing to win the blocks.

Entry Instructions and Rules**

Entry Instructions

- The 2010 Entry Form and other requested entry materials must be received **no later** than January 19, 2010.
- Submit entry materials at the December or January BCQG meetings or mail them to:
Sheri Jones

Grapevine, TX 76051
- **Each entry** shall consist of:
 - ◊ Completed (and signed) entry form
 - ◊ Judging fee (if applicable)
Fees to be paid in cash or checks made payable to Bear Creek Quilt Guild.
 - ◊ Color photo of the entry, labeled on the back with entrant's name and entry title
All photos become property of BCQG and will not be returned.
Photos can be taken at the December or January guild meetings at a cost of \$1.00 each
- The **fee** per each judged entry is \$5.00 for guild members. For non-members, the fee per each judged entry is \$15.00.
- Members of BCQG entering quilts must be current in 2009-2010 membership dues.

Rules

1. You must select a category for your quilt when completing the entry form. **Please take note that there has been a change this year in the categories. More categories are available for entering your quilts by having 3 different divisions...Master, Artisan, and Open Divisions. See the Entry Categories for detailed information.** If you are not sure of the appropriate category, please make the best choice you can and indicate your uncertainty on the front of the form. Then provide any additional information about your questions or concerns on the back of the form. The Committee will then review your information and make the final decision. **The Committee reserves the right to make changes in categories as it deems appropriate.**
2. Entries do not have to be finished when photographed. However, please turn in entry forms and photos only for quilts that you are sure will be finished before the show. To conduct a first-class show, we have to make specific plans regarding how best to display all our quilts. When a quilt doesn't show up as expected, we may have to leave a hole in the display, and that reflects poorly on the BCQG.
3. All entries in a judged category must be quilted by hand or by machine. No tied quilts will be allowed in judged categories. Garments must have a recognizable amount of patchwork, appliqué, and/or quilting.

4. Entrants are responsible for their own insurance on all items. The signed entry form releases BCQG and Will Rogers Memorial Center from any and all liability, and **all unsigned forms will be returned**. BCQG will take reasonable care to protect all entries but is not responsible for entries.

5. The Quilt Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry that it deems to be inappropriate or that fails to meet entry requirements. If there becomes a lack of show space, the Committee may need to delete an item; the entrant would be notified.

6. Items that have been exhibited in a previous BCQG show may not be entered again to be judged.

Preparation for the Show

Each entry must have a 4" double-casing sleeve stitched to the top of the back of the quilt. If the item exceeds 90" in length, please drop the sleeve down from the top.

Miniature quilts do not need a sleeve; they will be pinned to the drape. If you don't want your miniature to be pinned, please attach a sleeve and we will try to display it without using pins.

Each entry must have a 4"x 4" fabric identification label. When looking at the back of the quilt, this label should be stitched (not pinned) to the lower right corner of the quilt. A label must be stitched on the inside of a garment. The label must include name, address and telephone number.

Each item, including garments, must be submitted in a fabric bag with the entrant's name on the bag. Please include only one entry per bag. Claim checks will be issued when entries are checked in. **These claim checks must be presented before entries will be released.**

Entries must be clean and in good condition. Double knit cloth and "cheater cloth" are not permitted.

All entries must be delivered on Thursday, April 8, between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

Quilts may also be able to be delivered at a designated drop-off point to be announced later.

All entries must be picked up Sunday, April 11, immediately after the quilt show has been taken down and clean-up is completed.

No entry will be released before clean-up is completed, and no entry will be released without a signed claim check. Your help with the work and patience with the process will be greatly appreciated by all the hard-working show volunteers.

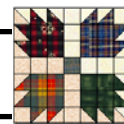
