Toppings: cooked and crumbled bacon, shredded Cheddar cheese, sour cream

There will be a special exhibit of antique handwork at the show. More information will be available on the website along with a special entry form. A bee is needed to make table decorations. Please let Donna know if your bee is interested. Bookmarks and flyers are available from Donna for members to distribute to places other than quilt shops.

Janice Irick requested that when members donate a small quilt for the silent auction at the quilt show that they place a label on the quilt with their name and the name of the quilt. These may be turned in anytime and at the March guild meeting.

Paula Burda is in charge of volunteers for the quilt show. Please let her know when you can help out.

Maureen Ciemian is the judges and ribbon chair of the quilt show. One of the judges, Nell Smith is also a certified AQS appraiser. Please let Maureen know if you are interested in having a quilt appraised.

Kayleen Allen, workshop chair, reminded guild members that the next workshops will be in May and then in October.

Shawn Frazier, raffle quilt tickets, requested that all ticket money be turned in by the March guild meeting. You may also mail the money to her before the meeting. She has a sign up sheet available to sit with the quilt and sell tickets at the show.

Retreat chair, Bonnie Miller, has emailed all participants with retreat information including a list of supplies and a map. Please email her with any questions.

Linda Davis, Community Service, reported that members donated 12 quilts for JPS and 1 for ASAP for a total of 84 hours. Squares will be available at the retreat and at the quilt show for sewing. 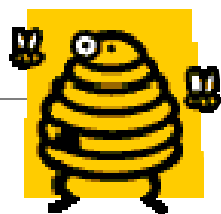
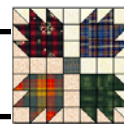

## Silent Auction

As previously reported, the 2010 Quilt Show Silent Auction will include any quilted item, e.g., small quilts, table runners, bags, pincushions, etc. We encouraged every member of the guild to submit at least one entry for the auction. **This is a great charity fund-raiser for our guild and we need you help.**

Deadline for entries are the March guild meeting and no entry fee or form is required but we do ask that you label items with a minimum being, the name of the item and your name as the maker.

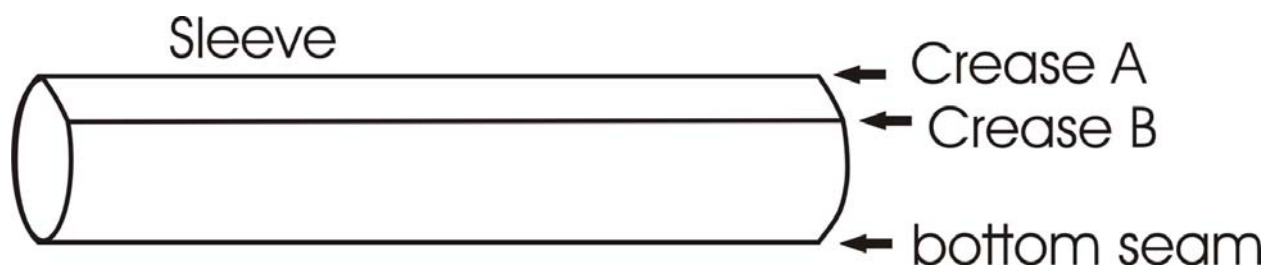
Judging of the auction entries will be limited to the small quilts that meet the following guidelines:

- Small quilts should be 24 inches or less on each side.
- You may use any technique you would like to make your quilt.
- Do not feel limited to making “miniature” sized blocks if you piece your quilt.
- The quilt must be bound and include a hanging sleeve wide enough to accommodate a small dowel.
- **Please label your quilt with, as a minimum, the name of the quilt and your name as the maker.**
- Only the small quilts will be subject to judging.

## How to Construct a Quilt Sleeve for Your Quilt

Each quilt entry in the quilt show must have a quilt sleeve attached to the back. Here are quilt sleeve instructions:



Construct the Sleeve:

Cut a strip of fabric 8" wide and as long as your quilt is wide. Make a narrow hem at each end (about 1/2"). Sew into a long tube using 1/4" seam. Turn and press with seam at the bottom.

Press a good hard crease at the top (crease A).

Pull this top crease (A) down 1" onto the tube and press another good hard crease (B). This second crease (B) will be your stitch line for the top of sleeve.

Attach to Quilt:

Place sleeve so the top crease (A) is just inside the binding edge along the top of your quilt and the 1" crease (B) is next to the quilt (hidden). Pin in place securely along the bottom and infrequently along the top.

Sew the bottom edge of the sleeve to the back of your quilt with blind stitches.

Remove the top pins and fold the tube down from the top to expose the 1" crease (B). Pin securely in place.

Stitch this crease (B) to the back of your quilt with blind stitches.
