Also 5 quilt tops with backing, one quilt top for Camp Crucis, one other quilt top, and 20 baby caps were donated. The total volunteer hours came to over 390 hours. You continue to demonstrate your generosity by all you do for the community.

The donated quilt tops with backing have been made into kits with batting. Please pick up a donation quilt kit at the next Guild meeting. Sew these kits to make donation quilts for JPS or the Batter Women's Shelter while perfecting your quilting skills on your home machine.

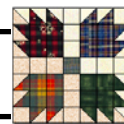
Jackie Brown's Workshop

Silent Auction 2012

For our 2012 Quilt Show the Silent Auction has been expanded. This year we will be accepting not only small quilts, but other items as well. You are welcome to enter table runners, placemats, bags or totes, even pincushions. We want to encourage every member of the guild to try and submit at least one item for the auction. All small quilt entries are still eligible for winning a ribbon by the judges; however no evaluations will be given to the ribbon recipients. The deadline to turn in your items for the Silent Auction will be the January 2012 Guild Meeting. Please pin your name to all of your entries. Below are the Guidelines for Small Quilts:

1. Small Quilts may have blocks or pieces of any size.
2. Quilts should be 24 inches or less on each side.
3. Any technique may be used (e.g. pieced, appliqué, or embellishing)
4. Small quilts must be bound and have a sleeve for hanging.

BCQG is a member of the Texas Association of Quilt Guilds (TAQG), represented by Sandra Hardin. TAQG has over 40 member guilds from all over north and central Texas. Guild representatives meet six times a year to discuss common issues, share a wealth of information, and have training sessions for guild officers.

Rally Day is the main annual event for TAQG guild members. All quilt guild members can attend (over 800 area quilters usually attend) to hear a national speaker and participate in workshops. There is a fee for the workshops but the speaker day is free. All you need for admission is your current guild membership card. This year the event will be Saturday, July 9, 2011 at Mimosa Lane Baptist Church in Mesquite. The guest speaker will be Terry Clothier Thompson (www.terrythompson.com). Go to the TAQG website and click on Rally Day (left column) for more information on the day's events and workshops.

You will receive a goodie bag at Rally Day. All the items are donated by the member guilds. BCQG is donating fat quarters again this year. Bear Creek Quilt Guild Board Meeting Minutes

President Michelle Lewis called the meeting to order at 6:42 pm.

A motion was made by Bonnie Miller to accept the minutes from March 2011. Shawn Frazier seconded and the motion carried.

In attendance: Michelle Lewis, Charna Gray, Shawn Frazier, Linda Davis, Dana Robbins, Eileen Drennan, Sandra Hardin, Bonnie Miller, Yvonne Hylander, and Peggy Burrell.

The treasurer report was given by Dana Robbins. She reported that income was \$439 and expenses were \$1178.20 net -\$739.20.

1st VP/Charna Gray – Upcoming speakers, Jackie Brown, Susan Myers, Michelle Watts. She is working on the 2012 programs and trying to share all out of town speakers with other guilds.

2nd VP/Quilt Show Chairman/Shawn Frazier – The logo is being finalized. She met with Hurst CF and found out the electric outlets are all in the middle of the floor not along the walls where she was planning to put the vendors. The layout map will have to be redone. Sherry Jones will chair layouts. There was discussion of doing a Guild calendar as a fund raiser. It was decided this is not a quilt show item and should be handed off to a different group. Shawn wants to have a quilt show email alert signup sheet at raffle quilt sales events. She also wants to put a flyer in the goodie bags at Rally Day.

Workshops/Yvonne Hylander- April workshop is full. It will be held at the Woodland Springs Amenity Center. The cost is \$60 which is covered by the workshop fees. There is a \$250 deposit but it will be returned after the workshop. The next workshop is June and two other venues were suggested, Brookside Center and Keller Police station. The policy that you must pay to

reserve a spot in a workshop will be emphasized.

Community Service/Eileen Drennan - took in 17 quilts for Camp Crucis from the retreat

Care Bear/Eileen Drennan – Pam Braunwieter's mother passed away

Door Prize committee/Lynn Horvat – Darlene Ward will co-chair.

Outings/Bonnie Miller – Camp Crucis has been booked for April 12 -15, 2012.

TAQG/Sandra Hardin – Rally Day, she needs quilts for the mini auction and fat quarters for goody bags. She will have pins, pre day basket tickets and lunch tickets at guild meeting.

Raffle Quilt 2011/Shawn Frazier – it will be announced at the next meeting that we will vote on charities to receive a donation in April.

Old Business

The raffle quilt made \$2789, expenses were \$410.59 so the net income was \$2378.41. Half of that amount is \$1189.20 which is earmarked for a charitable donation. Shawn Frazier moves to round that amount up to \$1200, Sandra Hardin seconds and the motion carries.

New Business

Quilters Stash is offering a discount to guild members when they show their membership card, after 2 months they will donate a sewing machine to the guild that we can raffle to members for \$1.00 per ticket.

Meeting adjourned at 7:47 pm.

Treasurers Report / Dana Robbins - income \$1221 expense, \$5116.96; -\$3895.96 net.

Programs/Charna Gray - next month will be Susan Meyers from Silver Star Mercantile, her program will be, "Let's Do Redwork".

Quilt Show/Shawn Frazier - We have a logo, the layout will be done on Friday, the website will be up and running before the next guild meeting. Eileen Drennan encouraged everyone to make items for the silent auction. Lucy Suggs talked about the Chairman's Choice block, fabric is available, and said there are only 6 states left for the Chairman's Challenge category. Judging is optional for these. Linda Davis announced that the quilt show categories will be in the next newsletter.

Membership /Peggy Burrell -76 members in attendance, 3 visitors.

Workshop /Yvonne Hylander –The Jackie Brown workshop for April is completely full. She will need help with set up and take down as well as needing extension cords and power strips. Michelle Watts will be here in June she is teaching a machine appliqué workshop and registration is

being taken with payment.

Outing /Retreat Bonnie Miller - The retreat was fun and the next one is scheduled for April 12-15, 2012. Michelle presented Bonnie with a gift certificate from the retreat attendees.

Community Service/Eileen Drennan - There were 17 Camp Crucis quilts turned in and they will be shown during Show and Tell. Kits are available to make donation quilts

Care Bears/Eileen Drennan - The card supply is getting low so if you can pick up a sympathy, get well or thinking of you and donate it next time it would be helpful.

TAQG/Sandra Hardin – She has to turn in lunch orders, raffle tickets etc by May 31 so next guild will be the last chance purchase these items. There are workshops on Thursday and Friday and she has the information at her table.

Old Business - The names of seven charities were presented for the guild to decide which should receive the raffle quilt money. Mid Cities Care Corps, ASAP, Ladder Alliance, Metroport Meals on Wheels, Royal Family Kids Camp, Happy Hill Farm Academy, Special Friends (Special Olympics). Votes were collected and there was a tie so three charities will each receive \$400 – Metroport Meals on Wheels, ASAP, and Special Friends.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:04 pm

Michelle Watts is a quilt artist that loves living in the Southwest region of the U.S. Michelle has been quilting for over 22 years. She has spent the last 15 years creating wearable clothing and quilts that express her love of the Southwest. Michelle designs southwestern quilt and wearable art patterns, southwest

fabrics, teaches classes and lectures throughout the U.S. She is also the author of 3 quilting books. Most of Michelle's quilts are machine pieced, machine appliquéd and machine quilted.

Michelle Watts is our teacher for our workshop in June. She will be teaching her appliqué method using the Santa Cruz quilt.

The Workshop Chairman will be registering interested members at our May meeting. Please bring check or money in order to sign up. There is a limited number of students that will be able to take the class.

June Workshop—Santa Cruz

Learn the basics of machine appliqué as you work on a couple of the blocks from the cover quilt of Michelle's book, The Quilted Cross. Students will have a choice of a couple of different blocks to work on during class. Patterns will be provided for the four blocks on the top row of the Santa Cruz quilt. Students will learn how to master inside corners, outside corners, curves as they work on their block. The finished block is suitable for a pillow, or the beginning of a larger wall hanging or quilt. Book not required for class.

YARDAGE REQUIREMENTS:

1 FQ background

1 - 5 coordinating FQ for appliqué

OTHER SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- Sewing machine in good working order with owners manual and all feet and attachments (Machine needs to do a zig zag stitch)
- Fusible web (Wonder Under, etc.)
- Freezer paper
- Thread to match selected fabrics or contrasting thread for appliqué
- Thread for bobbin (I use thread to match my background fabric)
- Iron and small ironing surface
- Basic sewing supplies- pins, needles, pencil, scissors, etc.
