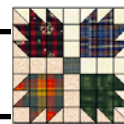

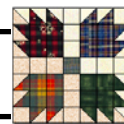

Going Green 2012



First Rule of Going Green!

Don't throw it away if it can be reused, repurposed or recycled.

1. Sharpen your rotary cutting blades. This saves you money and keeps them out of the landfills. (www.nancysnotions.com offers several items for blade sharpening.)
2. Save your scraps of Fabric and give to Grace for recycle. (Even the selvages are usable for recycle.)
3. Use your batting and fabric scraps for small quilts, table runners or rag quilts. (Ask me if you want instructions for the rag quilts- Easy Breezy!)
4. Use a pin or needle sharpening pin cushion to keep your needles and pins sharp.
5. Make use of the free items table at Guild for items you no longer need.
6. There is also a website called Freecycle.org that you can give things away or get free things. (Ask me about it! I use it all the time.)
7. Buy starch in liquid form and mix your own spray starch. A bottle goes a long way! (I buy a spray bottle I like and then use it until it gives out)
8. Bring in any books related to quilting that you haven't looked at in years and share them with another quilter.
9. Unplug your iron when you aren't using it. It uses energy, even when turned off.
10. Use an old pill bottle for needles, thread, thimble and pins when travelling or going to Bee.

would like for us to join other demonstrating artisans like knitters, weavers, and lace makers. We are the only quilting group asked to participate and our guild would get great exposure through our presence and being listed in the program. The Irish

Festival is a lively event full of music, food, and drink. Check out their website at <http://www.ntif.org/>. The Festival is held at Fair Park and lasts for three days but we are only looking for volunteers for a portion of that time. It's open on Friday evening, March 2nd, all day Saturday, March 3rd, and all day Sunday, March 4th. Our volunteers need to be there on Saturday from 10:30 to 4:00 and Sunday from 11:30 to 4:00. Working one 3 hour shift will earn admission to the Festival and one drink ticket. Working two 3 hour shifts will earn admission for two days, two drink tickets, and a Festival T-shirt. Questionnaire Results

At the January meeting, members were asked to fill out a short questionnaire. Thank you for the excellent responses and feedback. Here are the results.

1. What I like best about guild meetings. The majority of answers were fellowship, show and tell and the speakers.
 2. What I like least about guild meetings. The most frequent answer was the business meeting and the door prizes. The main criticism was that they take too long.
 3. Do you read the newsletter? 94% of respondents read the newsletter. Eliminating the secret word was mentioned by some.
 4. Do you like emails? 80% of members like email updates. Suggestions were made to only send email if the information could not wait until the newsletter.
 5. Why do you attend or not attend workshops? Members who attend are looking to learn a new technique and to be motivated to try something new. A common reason not to attend was time restraints with work. Some mentioned that attending created too many UFO's.
 6. Would you like snacks at the meetings? 80% said no.
 7. Suggestions for speakers and programs. These answers varied. Bringing in national speakers was a common response. The suggestions will be given to our program chair.
 8. What would improve meetings? The most common response was once again shortening the business portion and decreasing door prizes.
 9. What are your thoughts on an online directory? 63% of members think it is a good idea. Some reasons included easier to update and less expensive. Members could print their own copy at home.
- Anything else you would like to suggest. Suggestions included a guild face book page and recruiting younger members. Suggestions will be given to committee chairs.

March's Speaker—Sara Miller-Moe



Sara Miller-Moe is a self trained fiber artist. She created her first masterpiece on fabric in kindergarten when she painted a big red flower on a pastel pink dress her mother made for her. And as they say-an artist was born. In 7th grade she was introduced to sewing in a home economics class and began sewing her own clothes and making anything out of fabric. For years she designed her own couture clothing much of which was worn for a career in the computer industry.

In 2002, she landed a dream job as a Creative Consultant with Pfaff Sewing Machines. To prepare to teach a class at a quilting expo, Sara sewed her first

quilt. The class was based on a book that incorporated curved quilt blocks using templates. Despite her experience with sewing garments, sewing the curved blocks created quite a challenge for Sara. While putting together the blocks there was difficulty with the finished block sizes and the seams lining up properly. She quickly learned the pitfalls of using templates and of making quilts with curved pieced blocks. After teaching the class a few more times she witnessed firsthand the ongoing problems with the existing curved templates commercially available. She soon found herself launching a new business venture, **Sew Inspired™** and the **Sew Inspired Design System™**, to help quilters create unique curved quilts in an easier and more accurate way.

Winding Curves Workshop: This workshop uses the **Sew Inspired Design System™** Winding Curves Template, a fun “out of the box” template that creates a unique art quilt. The picture to the right shows the quilt that will be made in this workshop. Students will be taught Sara’s unique foolproof EZ curved piecing techniques so that even beginning quilters can sew perfect curved quilt blocks. Students will make the blocks for the Winding Curves quilt top and learn-



ing how to put them together to create a unique art quilt. Quilt design, and composition will be taught as well as tips and tricks for sewing curved pieced blocks. Sara will show the many different layout options to create original designs. This is a 6 hour hands-on class and students will be provided templates to use in the workshop and for purchase after the class.
